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## Teacher Training Online for English teachers of the Black Sea region



48 Georgian Teachers of English are participating in ETTO - an online teacher training course, which has been designed and initiated by the ELT experts in the British Council Turkey office. The course virtually connects teachers from the Black Sea region – Georgia, Turkey, Armenia, Azerbaijan and Ukraine.

Georgian teachers of English are given the opportunity to get involved in a completely innovative project and improve their practical teaching skills through online programmes and assignments. The start up meeting of the project was held in Tbilisi, Hotel Radisson on January 9. Participating teachers from Tbilisi, Kutaisi, Batumi, Gori, Rustavi, Ozurgeti and Sachkhere were invited to get acquainted with the general layout and peculiarities of this online course.

Priority for participation in this project was given exclusively to ETAG members. The project finishes in April, 2010. Successful candidates will be certified.

#### **Classroom Language Trainings**

#### 2010 Study of the United States Institutes (SUSI)



The U.S. Embassy in Tbilisi is pleased to announce a competition for the 2010 Study of the United States Institutes. This program is sponsored by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the U.S. Department of State.

Study of the United States Institutes are intensive six-week academic programs whose purpose is to provide participants with a deeper understanding of American life and institutions, past and present, in order to strengthen curricula and to improve the quality of teaching about the U.S. in secondary schools, colleges, and universities. Each program is designed for a multinational group of university faculty, researchers and secondary school educators and focuses on a particular American Studies discipline or theme, and is planned and conducted by a U.S.-based host institution (typically a college or university).

#### **Talking Videos**



15 teachers have attended a ten-hour teacher training course called Talking Videos. Young trainers Maka Mchedlishvili and Tamuna Nachkebia delivered the course in accordance with the video materials produced by the British Council experts in UK. Participants were able to watch sample speaking classes on DVD, listen to experts' feedback and then, reflect on what they heard and saw using their own experience in developing speaking skills of their own students. One more group started the training on February 6.
