The representatives of nine branches of ETAG attended the BRITISH COUNCIL ENGLISH & EXAMS CONFERENCE, which was conducted on 14 May, 2011. This conference aimed to raise awareness among major educational service providers, English teaching professionals and policy makers in Georgia about the British Council's services and products in English and Exams.

In September 2011, it is proposed to issue a Ministerial decree, making it mandatory for all higher education students to hold a foreign language proficiency certificate.

This conference was not just an event with a series of presentations. Everybody was given a practical chance to be engaged and share the success stories from the local practitioners.

Broadening Horizons in English Language Teaching



On June 11, 2011 English Teachers' Association of Georgia (ETAG), held its regional conference in Gori. The conference was offered for Gori region ETAG members. Apart from long standing members, the conference hosted a number of internally displaced English teachers currently working in the schools and universities of Gori and its surrounding villages. Guests arrived from Tbilisi, Rustavi and Kutaisi branches. The conference allowed the participants to get familiar with the newly established English

teachers certification exam as well as global trends in English language teaching and learning in general.



A Talk at ETAG

Michael Berman, a teacher and a writer gave a talk on one of the traditional Scottish ballads at ETAG in Tbilisi on June 15,2011. The Great Silkie of Sule Skerry Encounter narratives (meetings between mortals and supernatural beings) recorded in early modern European witch trials, provide evidence to suggest that popular shamanistic visionary traditions, of pre-Christian origin, survived in many parts of Britain during the early modern period. These traditions can also be found reflected in both our folktales

and our ballads as this talk showed. There are many stories in mythology and folklore about marriage between mortals and water-spirits and this example comes from the Orkney Islands, off the coast of Scotland.

Batch 2: 16 January – 2 April 2012


